

FRAMING. A MOTION WAS MADE AND APPROVED BY THE BOARD TO APPROPRIATE \$20,000 FOR TEMPORARY REPAIRS UNTIL KSL (SQUAW VALLEY) FINALIZES THE VILLAGE EXPANSION PLANS AND DESIGN. THOSE REPAIRS HAVE BEEN COMPLETED BY LOCAL CONTRACTORS AND TRADESMEN: BARRY THYS, MARCUS BURKHART, KEVIN SCHNEIDER, AND JASON GRUNST, UNDER THE DIRECTION OF DIRECTOR BURKHART. THOSE REPAIRS ARE 90% COMPLETED AT THIS TIME.

INTER-TIE DISCUSSION

The Board has been asked to discuss the idea of establishing an Inter-tie connection with the Public Service District. Mike Geary, Manager for the PSD distributed a site evaluation identifying five places where both companies could inter-tie during emergency conditions only, in the event of a major fire or pump failure, and that this was not a request to connect the 2 water systems to operate as one. Mr. Geary stated that he would prepare a proposal that reviews the 5 sites, consider the best alternative and a cost estimate at the next Mutual meeting.

Both the Mutual and the PSD would benefit from the inter-tie by having the ability to increase the volume of water for either companies. The PSD did apply and received a \$10,000 Grant for the inter-tie study. At one time there was such an inter-tie between both companies, located by the Old Bear Pen (corner of Squaw Valley Road and Christy). This connection was damaged, thus terminated when an underground cable was installed.

**OPERATION'S MANAGER
REPORT**

John Collins, Operations Manager reported that Clear and Still was awarded the Snow Removal contract for the 2012-2013 season. They will remove snow from the pump house with a loader and Dave Tormey will be clearing snow from the hydrants by hand shoveling.

The old and new hydrants have all been painted bright red, and have been staked.

As of November 28th, 2012 the water system is currently meeting state and federal standards. There were no positive test results during the month of October.

**ANNUAL BACKFLOW PREVENTION
DEVICE CERTIFICATION**

Backflow prevention devices are installed by a homeowner to protect the Mutual's water supply distribution system from possible contamination from a source within the property. This could be anything from a hydronic heating system, fire sprinkler system or your landscape irrigation system. Under an ordinance, the Squaw Valley Mutual Water Co. instituted a cross connection (backflow prevention) control program to be tested by an approved tester on an annual basis. The results are then sent to the Mutual's office. We will be sending you a letter if you do not submit your annual inspection and test results to the Mutual. Please help us keep our expenses down...**MARK YOUR CALENDAR**...and don't forget your annual backflow prevention device test. A list of qualified testers is provided below for your convenience.
